2. Alumni Delegate Information Due

The deadline for states to submit their delegates for the 2017 National FFA Alumni Association Annual Meeting is approaching. States must email their lists by 11:59 p.m. EDT on Oct. 8, 2017, to <u>alumni@ffa.org</u> to be eligible to have active voters at the meeting. The delegates will vote on <u>bylaw amendments</u> and regional vice president positions for the alumni council. The meeting will take place Friday, Oct. 27, 2017, at the Indiana Convention Center in Room 243-245 at 2 p.m. All alumni delegates must register for convention.

3. USDA Secretary of Agriculture to attend 90th National FFA Convention & Expo

We are looking forward to hosting Secretary Sonny Perdue at the national convention and expo. He will meet with the National FFA Foundation at noon on Wednesday, Oct. 25, and then at 2 p.m., he will moderate the first-ever #SpeakAg dialogues. That afternoon, he will visit the expo to see the various agricultural career pathways our members can explore. That evening, he will have dinner with a small group of state officers and then have press availability before he speaks at opening session 1B in Bankers Life Fieldhouse. He will end his

evening by attending the Rascal Flatts concert at Lucas Oil Stadium.

4. AgExplorer Continues to Be a Hit With Students

Over the last few months, we have spread the word about AgExplorer.com and seen an increase in usage. Our back-to-school marketing, coupled with the Syngenta Virtual Fieldtrip, helped drive a 220 percent year-over-year increase in website traffic, with an estimated 99,000 students reached. Thanks to our partnership with Meredith Agrimedia, we featured a full-page AgExplorer ad in *Successful Farming* magazine over the last three months. The total circulation of these advertisements to date is 411,260. We also contributed to an article that was published on the <u>Lancaster Farming website</u>. The article featured tips for choosing the right college and mastering the college admissions process. The college tools found on AgExplorer were highlighted.

5. Visit the AgExplorer Booth at the Convention and Expo

We are gearing up for an engaging experience at the AgExplorer booth (#1056) in the National FFA Expo. The following activities will be available for attendees:

- AgExplorer Scavenger Hunt—Students can pick up a Connect Four card at the
 AgExplorer booth and then visit with at least four industry professionals to find out
 about their careers and to take pictures/selfies to post on social media. When a student
 has completed four activities "in a row," they take their cards back to the AgExplorer
 booth to receive a T-shirt.
- Operation Innovation Station—Using the bottom portion of the Operation Innovation Station ad located on the guidebook map insert, students will visit five different companies marked with red beacons (there are 14 scattered throughout the expo). Students will check out the innovation the company offers and receive a stamp. Once they have collected five stamps, students can bring their completed cards back to the Innovation Station at the AgExplorer booth and receive a cool Ag Innovator pin. They will also be entered in a drawing to win one of the following: a drone package, virtual theater glasses, Nano 360 degree camera or a mini 3-D printer.

7. Student Delegate Committee Assignments

Student delegates have been assigned to one of the six delegate committees determined at

this summer's State Presidents' Conference. Research regarding each of the committees has been posted in advance for delegates and can be found on <u>FFA.org/delegates</u>. This information will also be provided to delegates at national convention.

8. Living to Serve Update

Since the start of the 2017-18 school year, National FFA has awarded nearly \$440,000 in Living to Serve grants to 227 chapters (middle/high school, alumni and collegiate) in 42 states and Puerto Rico. Funding opportunities still exist for state FFA associations or foundations as well as local FFA chapters as noted below:

- **FFA State Day of Service Grant** is now open! This is a competitive funding opportunity for all FFA state associations or foundations to help infuse service activities at the state level. States may apply for funds up to **\$8,000** to support a state-level day of service event as well as the promotion of the new Living to Serve Grant series. Applications are due Dec. 1, 2017. To access the application, visit FFA.org/livingtoserve/grants.
- **Day of Service Mini-Grants** are due the last day of each month. These funds provide alumni or middle/high school chapters with up to **\$400** to conduct a one-time service event. To access the application, visit FFA.org/livingtoserve/grants.

Ambassador Quinn shared with us that of the more than 10,000 high school students from across the U.S. who took part in World Food Prize programs, more than 40 percent of those students were FFA members and agricultural education students! Just as impressive: 50 percent of the USDA Wallace-Carver Fellows and 80 percent of the Borlaug-Ruan International Interns this summer were FFA members, a new record! When you have a moment, please read more about the 33 distinguished FFA members and agricultural education students chosen as the 2017 Borlaug-Ruan International Interns and 2017 USDA Wallace-Carver Fellows.

This is truly a major accomplishment for our FFA members. The Borlaug-Ruan International Internship provides high school students an all-expenses-paid, eight-week hands-on experience, working with world-renowned scientists and policymakers at leading agricultural research centers around the globe. The Wallace-Carver Fellowship offers exceptional high

school and college students the opportunity to collaborate with world-renowned scientists and policymakers through paid fellowships at leading USDA research centers and offices across the United States.

October is a busy month for both of our organizations—the National FFA Convention & Expo for us and the World Food Prize Borlaug Dialogue and Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, for Ambassador Quinn and his staff. Riley Pagett from FFA will attend the youth institute on our behalf. We look forward to meeting with Ambassador Quinn and his team later this year to explore new opportunities between our two organizations.

11. FFA Staff Member Kevin Keith Featured in Cover Story for Forever Blue
