# **Requesting State Officers or District President for Chapter Visits and Banquets:**

If you would like to have a State Officer or District President visit your chapter or attend your banquet please fill out a request form. Please visit this link to fill out your request: <u>http://www.nysffa.org/officers/</u>. Each chapter can request a State Officer or District President up to two times. Please put in your requests by October 1<sup>st</sup> so that we can secure it in one of our officer's schedules. If you wait beyond this date we may not be able to accommodate your request.

### **Update to State Officer Selection Date:**

Due to when school spring breaks fall this year, we have moved State Officer Selection to 4/2-4/4/2020. We realize that this may be the start of some schools spring break but we are limited to the beginning-mid April to host this process and this weekend will impact the least amount of people based on our research. This has been updated in our state google calendar which you can find on the events page. There is also a pdf document with the events listed by month.

### **Roster:**

As of August 1<sup>st</sup>, you can add students to your chapter's membership roster on <u>ffa.org</u>. As a reminder, NY is now an affiliate state which means you should be including all students taking an agriculture class on your rosters. If you have any 6<sup>th</sup> grade members, they should be added to the sixth grade only roster found here, towards the bottom of the page. 6<sup>th</sup> graders are added into the scale under affiliation membership. If you are registering sixth graders, please wait to submit payment until you receive an invoice from the State Office with the difference owed (if any) for adding your sixth graders. (*Example 1: If you have 23 members in* 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade on the national roster, you fall into the 1-25 member, \$200 bracket. Adding 10 members on the 6<sup>th</sup> grade roster, bumps you into the next fee bracket of \$300, so you will receive an invoice from the State Office for the additional \$100 owed. Example 2: If you have 35 members in 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade on the national roster, you fall roster, you fall into the 26-50 member, \$300 bracket. Adding 12 students on your 6<sup>th</sup> grade roster, keeps you within the 50 members of this bracket and you still owe \$300, so you will not receive an additional invoice. If you do not

receive an adjusted invoice within a week, please reach out to Catie Rowe or Nancy Grossman. If you are not adding any sixth grade members, please remit payment when your roster is completed and submitted.

On the membership page of our website, you will also find roster guides from National FFA

that will aid you in submitting your students in 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade. The easiest (and quickest) way to renew students for the new roster year is to follow the steps below. This only works for students who are *already* on your roster. Any new students need to have an account created, you can find information to add members <u>here</u>.

### **Steps to Renew Memberships:**

1- Log into your ffa.org account and go to your instructor tool box/dashboard

2- Go to roster tools, manage roster, manage memberships

3- In the search box, go to "membership year" and make sure it says "2018-2019," hit search

4- Check the box next to the students that you need to appear on the 2019-2020 roster.

5- In the "Actions" box, find "Renew Membership(s)" and make sure that "Membership Year" says 2019-2020. The membership type should be "**One Year**" for all students since we are affiliated.

6- Click on "Renew Membership(s)" This will reload the page and renew students for the new roster year. You want to see a green bar appear at the top of your screen.

7- Repeat steps 3-6 for each page of your membership roster

8- Once you have renewed all of your students, go back to the search box at the top, change the year to "2019-2020," and hit search. This will load all of the students that you just renewed.

9- Review the list and make sure that all students you need appear on the new roster.

10- Check the boxes next to student names, scroll to "Actions"

11- Click on "Submit Membership(s) to State) and make sure the green box says the number of selected memberships has been approved. If you get a red box at the

top of your screen, the issue will be hyper linked and direct you where to go to fix it. General roster information/ guides can be found here- <u>https://help.ffa.org/categories/roster/</u> Students can also be added to the roster through AET. If you use this program, you may want to consider doing this as it will save you from entering names twice. Please reach out to Catie Rowe with any questions on how to do this.

We highly encourage advisors to get their rosters done early in the school year so that their students have access to the many benefits that come with membership (participating at national convention, scholarships, etc.)

**Rosters are due on March 1<sup>st</sup>, payment should be post marked by March 15<sup>th</sup>.** To access your invoice, you need to go to "Manage Batches" on <u>ffa.org</u> and click "print membership batch details." Invoices for your roster on <u>ffa.org</u> are not automatically generated. Please reach out to Catie Rowe for any roster related questions.

### Kitchen and Dining Hall Update

After many months of planning, preparation, and fund raising the new facility replacing Widrick Lodge will begin to be constructed on October 4. Demo of Widrick began on August 18, and by September 18 the site has been leveled in preparation for construction.

The Last Supper in Widrick Lodge was a tremendous success. 243 guests attended the event which included historical tours of Widrick, seaplane rides, chicken BBQ dinner prepared by Alumni of the Albion FFA, and a robust auction that included live items, silent items, and raffle items. In total over \$75,000 was raised during this event, closing our funding gap to approx. \$130,000.

#### Tractor Restoration/Raffle

Retired teacher of Agriculture Jim Schiebel, and his wife Donna, donated their Ford 8N to be restored and raffled. More than \$8,000 was raised in this initiative which ended with a drawing of a winner during the last day of the State Fair. Austin Nolley won the tractor and opted to take the cash prize of \$2,000 which was also donated by the Schiebel Family. He

donated \$1,000 back to the FFA Foundation for the capital campaign and the Schiebel Family matched this donation.

This was the 12<sup>th</sup> tractor renovation and raffle conducted by the FFA Foundation. To date this project has generated nearly \$145,000 in revenue to support ag education in NY.
